The launch of our two publications was a great

success; John McKenzie House was a lovely venue and we had a great turnout, including several descendants of the prisoners who carved the little boxes. Twelve new members joined the YPHS on launch day, and three members renewed. We sold 17 copies of *From Hands Now Striving to be Free* and four copies of the 2009 *York Pioneer*; we also sold \$50 worth of back issues of *The York Pioneer* and several Cabin pins. Everyone enjoyed a wonderful tea prepared by several board members.

Sales of *From Hands ...* are going well; our first print run was 400 copies. Of those, approximately 200 were given to members, authors and subscribers; the other 200 have been sold. A second print run of 100 has been delivered and we are confident we will sell those as well.

Board Member Invited to Office of Lieutenant Governor

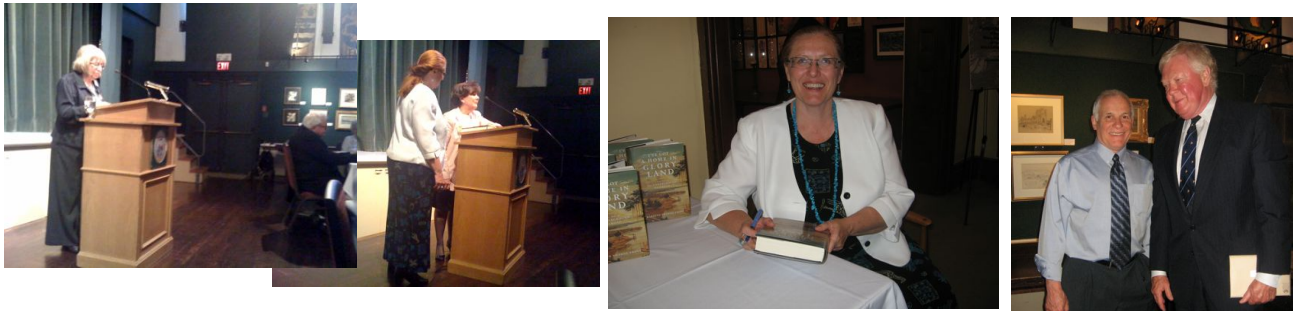

In Memoriam

HAINES, Ila: passed away in March 2009. A descendant of a Temple family, Ila was chair of the Sharon Temple volunteers for many years, during YPHS ownership, and was made an Honorary Life Member for her contribution.

SYKES, Catherine - May 2, 1921 - May 11, 2009. She and her husband Gordon joined the Society in 1985; both were Scadding Volunteers until 2002, when they moved to Ancaster. Gordon hooked the round depiction of the cabin that hangs over the settle.

TANCOCK, Elizabeth A. (nee Edwards) Born February 22, 1911, died May 28, 2009. 'Betty' swam for Canada in the Xth Olympic Games held in Los Angeles in 1932. She was a YPHS member from 1968 until her death, recording secretary from 1982 to 1990 and the author of 11 articles published 1977-1992 in *The York Pioneer*. KURTIN, Margaret Jean (Peggy), née Carscadden. Born October 7, 1932, died July 13, 2009. Peggy was extremely active in the heritage community and provided much of the research that led to the Heritage Designation for Cabagetown. She joined the YPHS in recent years.
